

Post Operative Instructions After Dental Implant Surgery

After dental implant surgery, you should follow these instructions:

Pain medication:

 Take prescribed pain medication as directed. Take all prescribed antibiotics as directed.

Swelling:

 Apply ice packs to the surgical area for 20 minutes on and 10 minutes off for the first 48 hours. Swelling is usually worst 2–3 days after surgery.

Bleeding:

 Bite on damp gauze for one hour after surgery, and repeat every 20 minutes as needed.

Diet:

 Eat a soft food diet for the first 4 weeks. Avoid hot liquids for the first 24 hours, and don't suck through straws.

Activity:

• Limit strenuous activity for the first 3–4 days after surgery.

Smoking:

Don't smoke for at least 5 days after surgery.

Healing abutment:

 If a healing abutment was placed on your implant, it may loosen. This is normal, and it's meant to come off for restoration. Just inform by contacting on the clinic reception.

Sutures:

 Sutures may come out with gentle brushing, and a small amount of bleeding is normal. Get your sutures removed 10-14 days after the surgery.

Sinus pressure:

(If sinus lift procedure is performed).
 Avoid putting any pressure on your sinus area for at least a month after surgery, this includes blowing your nose, sneezing, playing musical instruments.
